School Meals



All Primary school children in state-funded schools in London get free school meals for the 2023-24 school year.

The Mayor of London, Sadiq Khan provided the funding as an emergency cost of living support measure recognising that families are in urgent need of support and the meals will help families with the spiralling cost of living, making sure that children in state-funded London schools will receive free school meals in this academic year.

We are happy to confirm that the Mayor is extending the funding for **Universal Free School Meals for Key Stage Two** for another academic year 2024-25. We encourage you to take advantage of this free offer. It means that all children from Reception to Year 6 are entitled to a hot school dinner every day.

The English National Opera - Finish This..



Please may I remind you to consider the following:

- **Walking wherever possible**. Not only is this a healthy way to get some exercise, but it supports the local community with congestion. In addition, it is much better for the environment.
- Parking responsibly. As with the majority of primary schools in the country, we do not have a 'parent' car park. If driving is essential when dropping off or collecting your child, please park considerately and ensure you are not obstructing drives, garages or access to roads. Parking irresponsibly causes upset and frustration for all, which can lead to unnecessary confrontation Please be respectful of our neighbours and remember that parking on zig-zag lines at any time of the day is prohibited.
- Turning off your engine. An idling car can produce up to twice as many exhaust fumes than a moving car, which contain harmful pollutants that significantly affect the local quality of air putting people's health at risk, affecting children's development and contributing towards climate change. By reminding parents to turn their engines off whilst parked, we can help protect young lungs and create a cleaner, greener and healthier borough."

Our children's safety is our main priority and this includes their journey to and from school. We appreciate your support in this matter.

Please note the RAF Museum is providing 40 minutes free parking for all our parents/carers to ease the congestion on Great Strand.
