Did you know that a driver can see a pedestrian 3 seconds sooner if they are wearing or carrying something bright or reflective? That's enough to prevent serious injury or save a life!

Now that the clocks have gone back, evenings become dark much earlier and it becomes more difficult for drivers to see pedestrians.

Whilst we want children to get out and about more and have active healthy lifestyles, we also want them to be safe! Help your child <u>be Bright</u> so they can <u>be</u> <u>seen</u> by making sure they are wearing something bright for daytime AND reflective for night time.

\$CHOOL UNIFORM REMINDER

As winter is now upon us, I would like to remind you that children should be wearing black, royal blue or navy blue coats, scarves, gloves and headwear that keeps them warm. Any other colours (including pink) are not part of the school uniform code. Thank you for your cooperation.

Lost Property

Please clearly name all of your child's uniform. Anything that is named is returned directly to the children.

Lost property is stored in the school office. Children and parents are welcome to search for lost items at the beginning and the end of the day.

Children should be encouraged to look after their belongings and we will positively encourage this attitude in school.

PARKING at the beginning and end of the day!

The local authority are finalising an initiative to reduce congestion on Great Strand both on the road and footpath. You will be aware that the current situation is compromising the safety of all and therefore we need to work together. In the meantime, every driver and pedestrian has a duty and a responsibility to exercise common sense and behave in a sensible and courteous way. I know that as a community, we are very good at showing our care and support for one another, but sometimes, especially if we are in a rush, our frustrations can get the better of us and the sound of car horns and angry words fill the air. Please be patient. Better days are ahead and please continue to exercise care and consideration for others. I encourage you to use the car park at the RAF Museum where you can park for free. Blessed Dominic School is only a short walk away. Thank you for your ongoing support.

GOVERNORS' FUND WE NEED YOUR HELP!



Thank you to everyone who has responded this term with either a termly or complete payment for the year. The Governors would like to thank you for your generosity and support. Your ongoing generosity and support is greatly appreciated. It means that we can continue to purchase high quality resources to support your child's learning and prepare them for the future.

<u>Criteria for Attendance and Punctuality –</u> Updates from our Education Welfare Officer (EWO).



In an effort to improve attendance and punctuality across the school, we will be implementing the fixed penalty notice scheme for both persistent ABSENCE and persistent lateness.

Recently, our Barnet Education Welfare Officer came to review our attendance. She was disappointed to see that attendance wasn't as high as it used to be pre-covid times.

There are quite a few children who have attendance below **90%.** This figure is significantly below the national average and is considered as **persistent non-attendance**. **96%** attendance is expected by the school and the Education Welfare Team for children to achieve their educational potential. Children who are unwell (e.g., sickness, vomiting or high temperature) should not come to school but children who are slightly under the weather should attend. Please be assured, that if we feel your child is ill, we will send them home.

When your child is absent for **more than three days**, we would expect all parents to substantiate with **medical evidence**. This could include:

- a stamped doctor's appointment card,
- information about the medication your child has been prescribed (a photo can be emailed to the office or brought in on return to school).

As you know, we can administer medication on site (if it is prescribed by the doctor).

The Education Welfare Team from the London Borough of Barnet regularly monitor our attendance. They may contact you if your child's attendance is significantly low (below 90%). This may be a letter or a phone call. Absences before and after school holidays will also be monitored. If there is not a sufficient reason to substantiate the absence, the Education Welfare Team will issue a fixed penalty notice.

Families should also be aware that the London Borough of Barnet will issue a fixed penalty notice to parents if children are consistently arriving late into school. Any 6 incidents of lateness within a four week period could result in this outcome.

If you are experiencing any difficulties with your child's attendance, please contact the school for further guidance.

I would like to thank you for your continued support with regards to attendance.

Grey Trousers. Blue shirt (Long or short sleeve). School Tie. Royal Blue Knitted V neck Jumper (with embroidered logo). White/grey socks. Sensible plain black shoes (not trainers)

Summer Uniform

Grey shorts. Blue shirt (Short sleeve) White socks (no trainer socks please) School tie

Girls

Grey Tunic/skirt. Blue Shirt/blouse (Long or short sleeve) School Tie. Royal Blue Knitted Cardigan/V neck Jumper (with embroidered logo) White socks. Sensible plain black shoes (not trainers)

Black/grey woollen tights

Summer Uniform

Summer Dress (blue and white check) White socks (no trainer socks please)

P E KIT

White tipped Polo shirt (with printed logo) Royal Blue Shorts

School tracksuits top and joggers. Black plimsolls, plain white or black trainer

School Hats

School baseball cap (with printed logo) School sun hat (with printed logo)

Non-uniform jumpers and baseball caps are not allowed.

School Coats

School coats must be black or navy and ideally have a hood. No other coloured coats are allowed.

School fleece and waterproof jackets (with printed logos) are available to purchase from the school office.

School bags

Blessed Dominic Book bags for Foundation and Key Stage One

Blessed Dominic rucksacks (with logo) are permitted for Key Stage Two

All items of clothing should be clearly labelled even swimming kit.

Appearance

- 1. Children are not allowed to wear jewellery or any form of necklace or bracelet in school as this could be a cause of injury
- 2. Only children in Year 6 are allowed to wear watches but must accept responsibility for their own property. Smart watches and wearable smart technology are not permitted.
- 3. Nail varnish is NOT allowed
- 4. Sensible black shoes (flat)
- 5. Hairstyles must be simple, neat and tidy, of a natural colour and must be worn off the face.





Year 6 Travel Planning

Year 6 used TFL resources and local OS maps to plan safe journeys to school from their homes and to places in their local area. They enjoyed working with the resources and comparing their journeys with their peers. As a follow up activity to the session, they then were tasked with planning a safe journey from our local Tube Station to our school, before writing up their route and highlighting any dangers they may face along the way.



Traffic Consultations



5D were consulted on their views concerning the current situation regarding pick up and drop offs at the start and end of the day. They were encouraged to think deeply about how safe they felt at these times when commuting along Great Strand, the dangers the school population faced and ways forward to help make things safer. After mind-mapping and discussing ideas with their talk partners, they then shared their ideas in a whole class discussion, where their ideas were recorded and bought forward to the JTA

Road Safety Competition

Blessed Dominic entered a road safety banner competition led by Barnet as part of the celebrations for Road Safety Week 2023.

There was a fantastic turn out in terms of the quality and quantity of the entries received.

Three entries were chosen by the JTA and put forward as the schools entries –from Year 6 and from Reception.



5D's Road Safety Assembly

5D created and delivered an excellent Road Safety themed assembly, to showcase how to stay safe on the roads, focusing on the Green Cross Code and top safety tips for when being a pedestrian and a car user.

They gave a fantastic assembly, which was informative and eagerly performed by the class to show their learning and help educate others.
